## FOCUS:

To realize the depths of God's mercy for all of us. The mercy of God is a divine gift.

## BEFORE YOU BEGIN:

Light a candle and pray: Eternal God, in Whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible; look kindly upon us, and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is love and mercy itself.

## HEY DAD:

There are two special ways in which you can help with this lesson: lead your family in the Chaplet of Divine



Mercy, and help your saints assemble their "Big Mercy" booklets. On April 30, 2000, Pope John Paul II announced the canonization of Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska and, soon after, decreed that, "throughout the world the Second Sunday of Easter will receive the name Divine Mercy Sunday." The primary celebration on this day is, as always, the Second Sunday of Easter,



but within that, today's reading from the book of John tells us of the institution of the sacrament of Reconciliation. How appropriate it is that we should celebrate God's abundant mercy on this day!

In an address from the Shrine of Divine Mercy in Poland on June 7, 1997, Pope John Paul II gave the following reflections on this devotion to Divine Mercy: "There is nothing that man needs more than Divine Mercy—that love which is benevolent, which is compassionate, which raises man above His weakness to the infinite heights of the holiness of God.

"In this place we become particularly aware of this. From here, in fact, went out the Message of Divine Mercy that Christ Himself chose to pass on to our generation through Faustina. And it is a messsage that is clear and understandable for everyone. Anyone can come here, look at this image of the merciful Jesus, His Heart radiating grace, and hear in the depths of his own soul what Faustina heard: 'Fear nothing. I am with you always.' (from her diary, 586)

"The Church re-reads the message of mercy in order to bring with greater effectiveness to this generation at the end of the millenium, and to future generations, the light of hope.

"At no time and in no historical period—especially at a moment as critical as our own—can the Church forget the prayer that is a cry for the mercy of God amid the many forms of evil which weigh upon humanity and threaten it. 'The more the human conscience succumbs to secularization, loses its sense of the very meaning of the word "mercy," moves away from God, and distances itself from the mystery of mercy, the more the Church has the right and the duty to appeal to the God of mercy with loud cries.'

I pray unceasingly that God will have mercy on us and the whole world."

# Prayer From The Chaplet of Divine Mercy





# DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

SUNDAY CONNECTION: On Divine Mercy Sunday, April 30, 2000, Sister Maria Faustina of the Most Blessed Sacrament was canonized in Rome by Pope John Paul II. She thus became the first saint of the Jubilee Year, ushering in the third millennium.

In 1931, a young Polish nun named Sister Faustina Kowalaska saw a vision of Jesus. Jesus stood before her with white rays streaming from His heart. He told Sister Faustina to have an artist paint a picture of Him just as she saw Him. Underneath the picture, He instructed her to have the artist write, "Jesus, I Trust in You!"

Sister Faustina was then told to write down everything Jesus would tell her of His mercy. She was to keep a diary so others would come to know and trust in Him. Jesus said that His mercy was available to even the greatest of sinners.

Jesus also promised several things to Sister Faustina. He said that if people would follow His special instructions, they would receive His great mercy. In her diary, *Divine Mercy In My Soul*, Sister Faustina reveals that the mercy of Jesus is unlimited and available to even the greatest sinners. These are some of the revelations Jesus told her to write:

The Feast of Mercy - The Sunday after Easter: "On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open." Diary, 699

The Hour of Great Mercy: For those who immerse themselves in the Passion of Jesus Christ at the 3 o'clock hour,

"I will refuse nothing to the soul that makes a request of Me in virtue of My Passion." Diary, 1320 The Chaplet of Mercy: Jesus said, "Through the chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for will be compatible with My will." Diary, 1731

The Sacraments of Mercy:

"The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion (for the Feast of Divine mercy) shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." Diary, 699

Two of the key points of Divine Mercy are *trust* and *mercy*. We are asked by the Lord to *trust* Him in all things, and if we approach Him with a sincere heart, He will pour out His unlimited *mercy* on us.

God expects us to let His mercy flow through us to others. Jesus told Sister Faustina:

"I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere." Diary, 742

Jesus tells us, "You must not shrink from this (showing mercy) or try to excuse or absolve yourself from it. I am giving you three ways of exercising mercy toward your neighbor: the first — by deed; the second — by word; the third — by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy, and it is an unquestionable proof of love for Me." Diary, 742 (emphasis added)





The angel was ready to strike a terrible blow to the earth. Sister Faustina was horrified! Then a prayer came to her:



"Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world." *Diary, 476* 

When Sister Faustina prayed this prayer over and over, the Angel of Chastisement withdrew the sword and went away. The prayer made a difference! Try as a family to memorize this prayer, taking it line by line. Say this prayer, trusting God to always answer you according to His holy will.

- Eternal Father: (the one, true God, Who was, Who is, and Who is to come)
- I offer You: (I present as a sacrifice)
- The Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ: (the awesome, powerful, and selfless love shown by God's Son as He handed Himself over to be crucified)
- In atonement for our sins: (in payment for all the ways we have done things that are not pleasing to God)
- And those of the whole world: (Jesus took upon His shoulders all the sins of humanity so we would be made right with God once more.)



# Jesus wants us to FEAST at the fount of His mercy!

The heavenly banquet awaits us! Jesus has prepared a place especially for you and me. Our goal as saints is to have a seat at the head of the table. When we fall short of this goal, Jesus welcomes us back with the grace of His mercy. He tells us:

"Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy." Diary, 699

The Feast of Divine Mercy is celebrated the Sunday after Easter. Jesus tells us:

"On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy." Diary, 699

All of these graces and promises are available to everyone who calls on the mercy of Jesus with great sincerity and trust! He will fill us to the top with His grace and mercy!


